Legal Aid Society of Hawai'i Fellowship

The Legal Aid Society of Hawai'i seeks applicants for the Legal Aid Fellowship. The fellowship was created in cooperation with the William S. Richardson School of Law as a reflection of our shared commitment to the support and development of talented public interest attorneys in Hawai'i.

The fellowship is available only to 2010 and 2011 William S. Richardson School of Law graduates who have an interest in, and demonstrated commitment to, public interest law. Beginning in August or September of 2011 and continuing for a period of two years, the Fellow will serve as an attorney for the Legal Aid Society of Hawai'i providing legal assistance to low-income residents of Hawai'i. The Fellow will be based in one of Legal Aid's three Oahu offices (Honolulu, Windward & Leeward), or in Hilo, Kona, Maui, or Kauai, depending on the fellow's proposal and the needs of the organization. During this time period, he or she will be expected to develop a unique project that will significantly enhance the delivery of legal assistance to the low-income community of Hawai'i.

Salary for the fellowship position is comparable to the salary of Legal Aid staff attorneys.

Applications must be submitted no later than January 30, 2010, by electronic submission of a resume and cover letter to Angela J. Lovitt, Director of Training and Special Projects, at anlovit@lashaw.org. The Legal Aid Society of Hawaii is an Equal Opportunity Employer.
