The mission of the Legal Aid Society of Hawaii is to address critical legal needs through high quality legal advocacy, outreach, and education in pursuit of fairness and justice.

OUR FOUNDER

JUDGE BETTY M. VITOUSEK

Betty Belle Morrison was born in Wenatchee, WA. in 1919. After graduating from Lewis and Clark High School, she attended the University of Washington, earning a bachelor's degree in sociology in 1940.

That year she traveled by ship to Japan as a delegate of the American Student Conference. While on board, she met and became friends with Roy Vitousek of Honolulu. After the war, they reconnected and were married in December 1945.

They attended law school at Stanford University and graduated together in 1948.

After graduating from Stanford, Judge Vitousek practiced adoption law for a number of years. She conducted the research which led to the **formation of the Legal Aid Society of Hawai'i.** She became the first executive director of the Hawaii State Bar Association and worked with Judges Gerald Corbett and Samuel King to pass legislation establishing Family Courts in Hawaii, only the second state to do so.

In 1970, Gov. John A. Burns appointed Judge Vitousek to the newly created Family Court of the First Circuit, and was named Senior Administrative Judge of the Family Court in 1977.

Judge Vitousek was an early advocate of mediation, and also started "Divorce Experience," to help divorcing couples to understand the process, both legally as well as emotionally. Today the program is called "Kids First" and is mandatory for couples with children.

Judge Vitousek's influence extended beyond Hawaii. She served as national president of the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts, was named a delegate to the White House Conference on Children, and served on the board of the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court judges.

Judge Vitousek retired from Family Court in 1988, and passed away on August 28, 2017, at the age of 98.

MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

E lauhoe mai na wa'a; i ke kā, i ka hoe; i ka hoe, i ke kā; pae aku i ka 'āina

Everybody paddles the canoes together; bail and paddle, paddle and bail, and the shore is reached.

The end of March began a new reality for Legal Aid. Over the course of a few days, our operations went remote and we rose to the challenge to ensure that our clients still had access to justice.

We did not stop and have not stopped providing civil legal services across the state to those most in need.

Our outreach team continued to serve our houseless neighbors, and our intake hotline continued to take calls for those in need. Our kūpuna legal services staff made social distanced home visits so kūpuna did not need to leave their homes to get vital documents completed. In the height of the pandemic, our attorneys continued to go to court to represent clients in restraining orders for protection or to keep a landlord from locking someone out.

The shutdown of our state's economy caused unprecedented demand for government services like unemployment and public assistance as well as a growing need for resources to understand the latest emergency order from the Governor as it impacted the possibility of eviction or to understand new federal programs and rules.


Uniquely situated to assist, Legal Aid staff quickly pulled together resources that explained the latest on eviction moratoriums and how to apply for unemployment. Resources were translated and made accessible to communities across the state. Our website resources, brochures, and online events helped countless residents in Hawai'i. We also advocated for language access in unemployment and spoke out on behalf of tenants facing illegal attempts at eviction.

As we look toward the future, we know that it will take time for our economy to recover and that for many facing economic hardship, eviction, debt, and family crisis, accessing safety net services like Legal Aid will be a first time experience. But, we will be here and will continue to address these issues together.

Together we have bailed and paddled, paddled and bailed, and working together we continue to work to build a just society.

The Legal Aid Society of Hawaii is at the forefront of some of Hawaii's greatest challenges. Challenges such as homelessness, unemployment, evictions and foreclosures, child safety, benefits and other hardships faced by members of our communities. Every day Legal Aid helps those who have no other recourse. in order to achieve a fair and just outcome. In doing so, Legal Aid improves lives and strengthens our communities one by one, family by family.


In a typical year, Legal Aid receives over 9,000 inquiries and takes on more than 6,500 cases. But due to the Coronavirus pandemic, the number of inquiries has increased to more than 12,000, on an annualized basis, which is stretching all available resources. Legal Aid responded to this new operating environment by working longer hours, implementing flex schedules and developing new client engagement protocols and procedures to ensure the safety of those we serve and our team.

At some point, the pandemic will ease and a new normal will emerge, but there will be a lasting impact on those affected by the virus and on our communities. Thus, even after the virus subsides, the need for legal aid services is likely to remain at elevated levels for the foreseeable future.

Effective client engagement practices will become even more important as will the expansion of funding sources beyond traditional state and federal grants given budgetary constraints.

I was overwhelmed on how I would receive help on becoming a legal guardian of my minor siblings. In 2018 we lost our older brother. In April 2019 we lost our father and our mother in December 2019. I lived in Waianae and my siblings were living in Kalihi. All I knew was to care for my siblings.

Legal Aid helped me with the petition for legal guardianship and get court fees waived. Due to Legal Aid's help I was granted unlimited legal guardianship for my minor siblings. With set backs and many court hearings being cancelled due to Covid-19, I now can address their needs legally (medical, schooling, therapy, and etc.).

In 1991 I separated from my first husband, and because we owned a small business and he was the talent, I was left to look for a job. Because we had no real assets to split, it should have been a quick process, but my husband was not willing to sign the divorce papers for almost 2 years.

I was struggling to provide health insurance and as much as I resisted, I was advised to apply for food stamps and Medicaid for my son.


It broke me but I did it for a few months and it helped me get on my feet. Your staff reminded me that I paid into a system that is a safety net for exactly my situation. It was humbling.

During that time I enrolled in a community college to complete my bachelors degree. I later remarried, moved to Oregon for 16 years for my husband's job, and I started a healthcare consulting business. We moved back to Hawai'i 7 years ago when we became empty-nesters. This month is my 17th year in business and I have employees in 3 states including Hawai'i.

I have referred women in domestic violence situations to seek help from your organization over the years. You are the safety net for so many. It was my pleasure to be able to donate during these trying times when DV victims need our help more than ever.

I will forever be grateful to the Legal Aid Society of Hawai'i for helping me in my greatest time of need.


